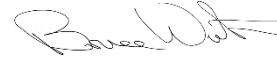

Cllr R Tatla reported that she had met with Shabina and had the following feedback:

- The Pantomime visit had been successful
- Youth Group at Spencers Wood Pavilion (SWP) had one evening cancelled due to the lights not working at SWP
- The viability of the group being bussed to SWP was being reviewed as it was time consuming for Mark Tomkinson (WBC) in collecting and returning the mini bus to Wokingham. Numbers had fallen so they may return to the Flat in North Shinfield
- It was recognized that this cohort were very different from the group run by Mark Sandringham who wasn't familiar with working with a group where 'special needs' youths were in attendance where more time was required for preparation. The Clerk agreed to follow this up
- Anti-Social Behaviour was still a problem at SWP on a Wednesday mainly from youths not taking part in the youth club but being in the vicinity

Millworth Lane

20.1 Cllr I Clarke reported that he had a meeting on 3rd February 2023 and would report back to the next meeting

ACTION – Clerk to add to the next agenda

20.2 The Clerk advised that there had been no progression on the discussion on 'Heads of Terms' for a potential fitness training facility as the focus had been on the sports consultation. That consultation would suggest support for the concept and so the Clerk proposed to continue to resume the discussions.

ACTION – Clerk to continue discussions on 'Heads of Terms' with the fitness training company

20.3 The original business model was based on the sports originally put forward for Millworth Lane. This would need to be adapted as the actual sports provision was refined.

ACTION – Clerk to update business model to reflect the latest proposals for Millworth Lane

20.4 There was an initial discussion regarding the results of the questionnaires completed at the Sports Consultation

The Clerk reported that:

Over 200 people attended

There were 46 responses on the day and, to date, a further 40 responses via the website. The larger the sample size the more likely it was to reflect the views of the general population although this was still just a sample

There were a good range of responses, with representation from both ends of the age range covered, with almost a 2:1 female to male representation

It was noted that that nobody stated that they would use public transport to get to Millworth Lane, even though this was one of the planning assumptions about High Copse

Of sports eight sports identified in the questionnaire, netball seemed to be the least preferred, but a lot of people verbally seemed to favour one combined netball/basketball court. Of the “write ins” a few thought that cricket should stay, as should football, and table tennis seemed to interest a few respondents. A running track was another popular request and should probably be included (by adapting the access footpath that would be required in any case)

Generally, people were prepared to ‘pay as you play’, but there was a reluctance to have any kind of membership. The pavilion should be included in the proposals, even if only as an opportunity to provide access to toilets

In terms of general comments there was some support for a 3G pitch in the location but the concerns of local residents regarding parking and access would need to be addressed. This would mean providing a larger car park than originally envisaged to avoid cars needing to park in the lane itself and improving access to Hyde End Road.

A list of essential equipment that would be required was circulated with the agenda. Revenue would be obtained through chargeable rent and match fees. The equipment would belong to SPC who would be responsible for the maintenance and replacement, in time, and would need to be covered by an occupational licence. It was recognised that there were eight cricket clubs in Shinfield and the costs for maintenance would be factored into the contact price. The ground would also be used for football. It was agreed to allocate CIL money for the capital costs.

Bookings Report

- 24 .1 The Clerk reported a further slight improvement in the forecast outturn for School Green Centre compared to the last report. He had now included utilisation figures.

At the school Green Centre the 10 largest room hirers accounted for 45% of total bookings which at Spencers Wood Pavilion the top ten hirers accounted for over 75% of bookings. The Clerk felt that these ratios were appropriate given that SWP was managed remotely and benefitted from having more regular hirers while SGC had staff on site to manage any issues that may arise.

Other locations ended to go for a limited period of time on specific days of the week which created more of a reason to attend and more likelihood of creating a critical mass for attendees. The Clerk recommended that the warm room continue and would bear this information in mind if it was decided to offer the provision next winter

26.3 Ukraine Event

The Clerk reported that this event would proceed. Attendees would receive soup and a roll and bacon butties (or vegetarian option) in the morning. A Ukrainian singer would provide entertainment along with a live band. It was felt that a charity event along similar lines could take place annually.

26.4 Community Noticeboards

The Facilities Manager reported that a quote for digital notice boards had been received for £6,000 each which was considered too expensive. It was felt that a map showing where the existing notice boards were would be useful to help identify any new areas that needed to be covered. It was felt that dividing the notice boards into areas for Parish Council business and Community event would be more attractive.

Proposal for the Division of Recreation & Amenities Committee

At the most recent Full Council meeting, it was suggested that a division of the roles and responsibilities of the Recreation & Amenities Committee might be appropriate.

This paper is an initial proposal produced entirely by the Clerk for discussion on how that may work in practice.

Division of Responsibilities

- Facilities Committee
 - This committee would be responsible for physical council assets
 - Allotments
 - School Green Centre
 - Spencers Wood Pavilion
 - Millworth Lane
 - Playgrounds
 - Manor (when under SPC control)
 - High Copse (when under SPC control)
 - Playgrounds
 - It is envisaged this committee is very much focussed on the efficient and effective use of council assets and the delivery of high-quality services
- Arts, Culture and Events Committee
 - This committee would be responsible for
 - Promoting arts & culture in the parish
 - Developing and delivering an SPC events programme
 - Including where SPC is working with third parties e.g. Spencers Wood Carnival
 - Provision of public realm art e.g. sculpture
 - Liaison with Shinfield Studios, Shinfield Players and similar organisations

Process

If approved, the division could be achieved as follows:

- The budget process would take place with the division in mind with relevant budgets being assigned to the appropriate committee
 - The division could be implemented either in
 - April 2023 for the start of new financial year OR
 - May 2023 following elections and new makeup of Council
- Meetings
 - To avoid overload meetings could take place in alternate months
 - As is the case already with Staffing and Finance & General Purposes Committees
 - In the month there was no meeting there would be a meeting of the Chair, Vice Chair, Clerk and Deputy Clerk to maintain momentum on items
 - For example
 - Facilities meets - 2nd Thursday of Jan, Mar, May, Jul, Sep, Nov
 - Arts, Culture & Events meets – 2nd Thursday of Feb, Apr, Jun, Aug, Oct, Dec

Membership

- Members are asked to consider (assuming they favour a division of the committees) the composition of the committees
- The Clerk is concerned that if the composition of the two committees is largely the same then the distinction between the two new committees would be largely lost

Working Parties

- It is proposed that where the need for a working party is identified
 - It is clear which of the two new committees is responsible for the working party (and to whom the working party should report)
 - Any such working party should have at least two members of the other committee in order that there is an effective sharing of knowledge

If the division is approved in principle some additional work could be carried out to prepare terms of reference for each of the new committees
