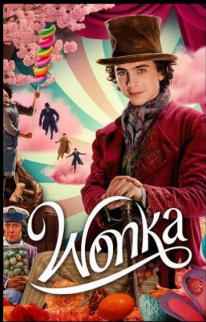

Shinfield Volunteer Group Footpath Report - September 2024



Welcome to our footpath report for September.

The foliage issues have died back to some degree but of course waiting to fill the gap will be muddy conditions and already the paths anywhere near the river Loddon have flooded. There are some issues for your interest.

Shinfield 3.

This important footpath from Cutbush Lane East to footpath 4 was suffering from dangling brambles overhead which we had already snipped off. Due to the very wet autumn they put on a further spurt so during October we will be attacking them again.

Shinfield 4.

This footpath also from Cutbush Lane East running up to the footbridge over the Loddon is now fully open and it was noted that a patch of Giant Hogweed is growing at the side of the path where it passes Shinfield Grange. This is nasty stuff and skin contact should be avoided. We have reported this to Wokingham Borough Council because the only effective way to deal with this is chemical destruction. A photo is attached for your interest.

Shinfield 12.

This footpath from Hollow Lane crosses footpath 11 and joins 13. The path is partially closed for the construction of the new supermarket but there is limited access into the housing estate. One of the residents took up our call to report issues to us and advised that brambles and overhanging foliage was making life difficult. We were able to cut this back so that pedestrians could walk there without getting snared by brambles. Such time as the new store opens and the path is open we intend to make this short path more appealing. Please don't ask me where footpath 13 runs because although we know the start and finish, a large part of the route is now pavements in Shinfield West. When all the building work is complete we will see what signage is feasible.

Shinfield 7 and the permitted path.

I have left this until last because it is a bit complex. I would like to take you back to the days before the Eastern Relief Road (ERR) and the new housing estate on the bottom end of Cutbush Lane. Footpath 7 ran from Oatlands Road to Cutbush Lane. The permitted path provided by Reading University ran from the footbridge on footpath 7 down to meet footpath 6 in the flood plain behind the Magpie and Parrot. Post ERR and the housing, footpath 7 is still between the points mentioned but apart from the first 100 metres from Oatlands Road it is seldom used. This is because the excellent surface from Oatlands road links with the nice road running parallel in the housing estate. Who is not going to choose that route over the bramble and nettle infested old path.

The permitted path is however a different proposition altogether. No longer accessed from the footbridge, one must stay on the tarmac and head towards the ERR. It appears this path will be open eventually above the play area but at the moment it is closed until further along where the pedestrian/cycle way arrives from Cutbush Lane. The short section of gravel down to the kissing gate does not appear suitable for the surface here because the recent downpours have eroded it. I have attached a photo for your interest. Please be careful if you use this section of the path and in any case once you cross the ERR; you must be prepared to find flooding in the meadows. I am sorry if I have dwelled on this issue a bit but thought it would be good for longstanding as well as newer residents to know the background.

Don't forget if you encounter something that you feel is not quite right, it probably isn't, so do what your fellow resident did with footpath 12 and let us know because we may not be aware of the issue.

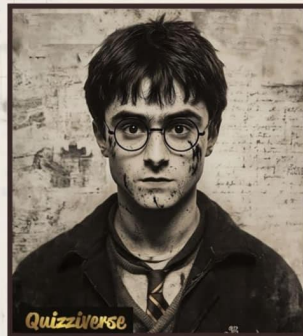

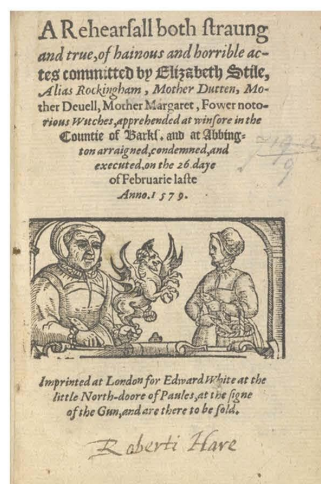
