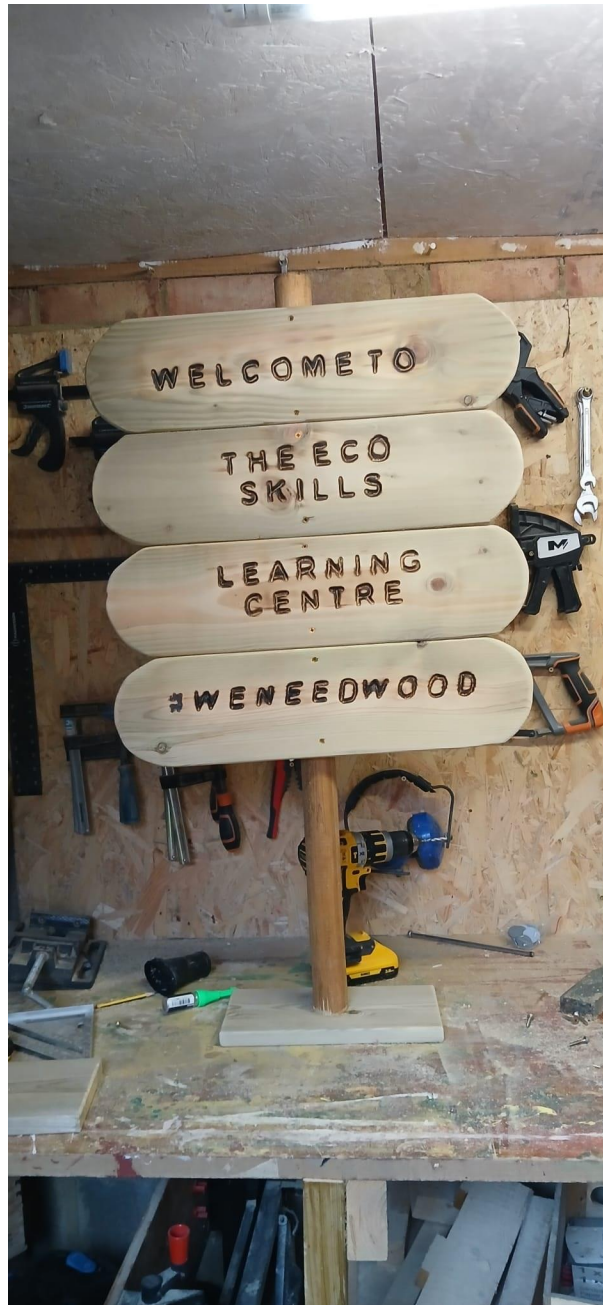
ECO Skills Learning Centre & 3 year anniversary of Lambs Lane Repair Cafe

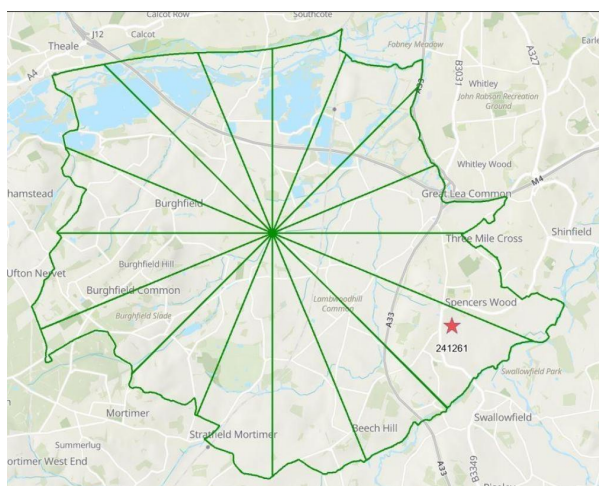

Letter from West Berkshire Council

The AWE has a specific emergency planning zone, known as the Detailed Emergency Planning Zone (DEPZ), around its Aldermaston and Burghfield sites. This zone is defined by the local authority, West Berkshire Council, who is responsible for planning and executing emergency responses within the zone. The DEPZ is reviewed every three years, and its precise boundaries are determined by factors like geographical features, roads, and footpaths. The current DEPZ around the Burghfield site includes properties like Poundgreen Farm, James's Farm, and St. Mary's Church and Parish Centre. A map of the DEPZ for AWE Aldermaston is available on West Berkshire District Council's website. To sign up for emergency text alerts from AWE, residents, businesses, and local organizations in Shinfield and Reading can text "A" to 0786 003 0391 for Aldermaston, "B" for Burghfield, or "Both" for both sites, [according to West Berkshire Council](#). You will receive a confirmation message once registered. To unsubscribe, text "Stop A," "Stop B," or "Stop Both" to the same number. These alerts are designed to notify you in the event of a radiation emergency at AWE, guiding you on what actions to take.

Shinfield Volunteer Group Footpath Report - May 2025





Shinfield Volunteer Group reported - It's been another busy month and I was grateful that some of our footpath monitors/volunteers were able to find some time to not only report some issues but in some cases dealt with the clearing side.

I won't put them up on pedestals but suffice to say we as a group carried out the following work during May.

Shinfield 4.

This footpath running from Cutbush Lane East to the river Loddon has undergone some changes brought about by the hard surface track installed by Reading University. Some of the definite path line can be bypassed now by the new track but there is still a section that runs alongside Shinfield Grange. This section is prone to a patch of Giant Hogweed that springs up. This was reported to WBC and was dealt with. I should say it appears to have just been cut and not chemically treated so it will return.

Shinfield 6.

The section of this footpath running alongside the once named Magpie and Parrot was overgrown. This was strimmed by one of our team.

Shinfield 12.

This footpath running from Hollow Lane towards the Lidl store is generally quite serviceable but it was felt a small amount of strimming would be beneficial so this was done by one of our team.

Shinfield 18.

You may remember that we uplifted a section of this footpath adjacent to the M4. The Blackthorn does its best to grow out over the footpath line but we want to train it to grow up and not out. We could not be sure that our friends at the Countryside Service would trim this back in the autumn so while it was minimal and soft we used our hedge trimmer to shape it. In the absence of any other pictures I have included a couple for this item.

Shinfield 28.

As mentioned in earlier footpath reports this is quite an important little path running from the northeast in Leyland Gardens, southwest to Hollow Lane. We have largely regained control of the obstructing foliage but there is still a small amount left to do and that will happen shortly.

Also along this footpath at the junction with the very old link to Leyland Gardens which has now become a definitive footpath there is an issue with high foliage blocking out the street light as it shines down. A number of residents asked if we could do anything about this so we asked advice from WBC. They have advised they will contact the landowner with the view to getting the foliage trimmed back.

If you like gardening and feel you could help as a SVG volunteer, maybe cutting a few brambles back we would like to hear from you. Our contact details are below.

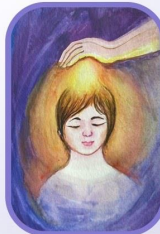

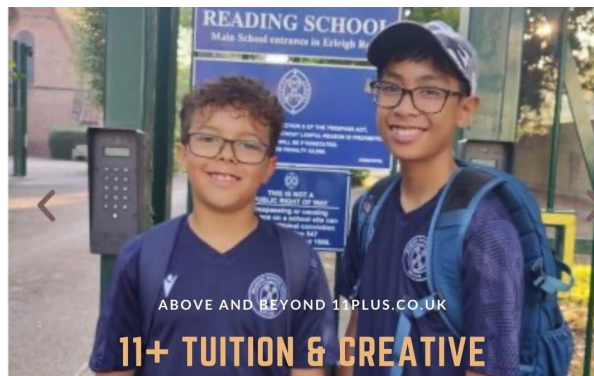
