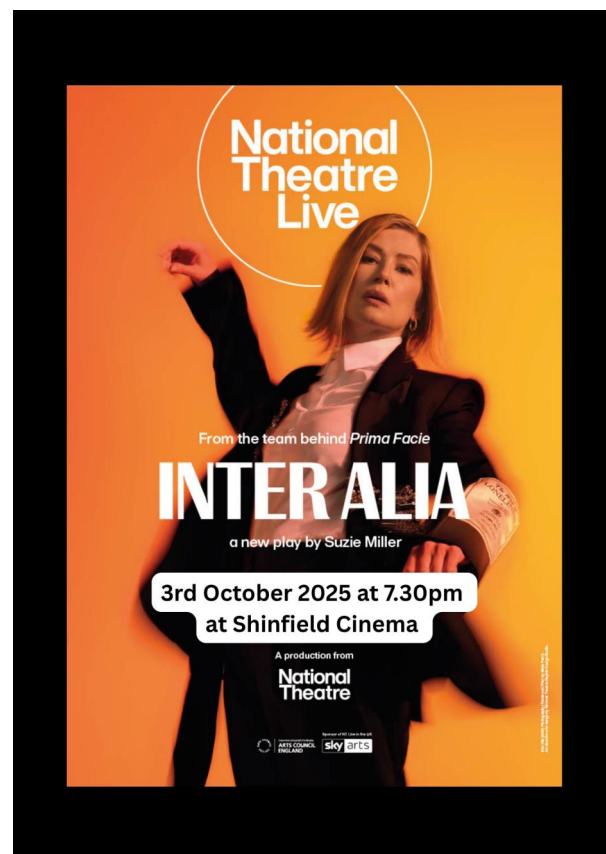
Full Council met on 24th September where discussions took place on the following:--

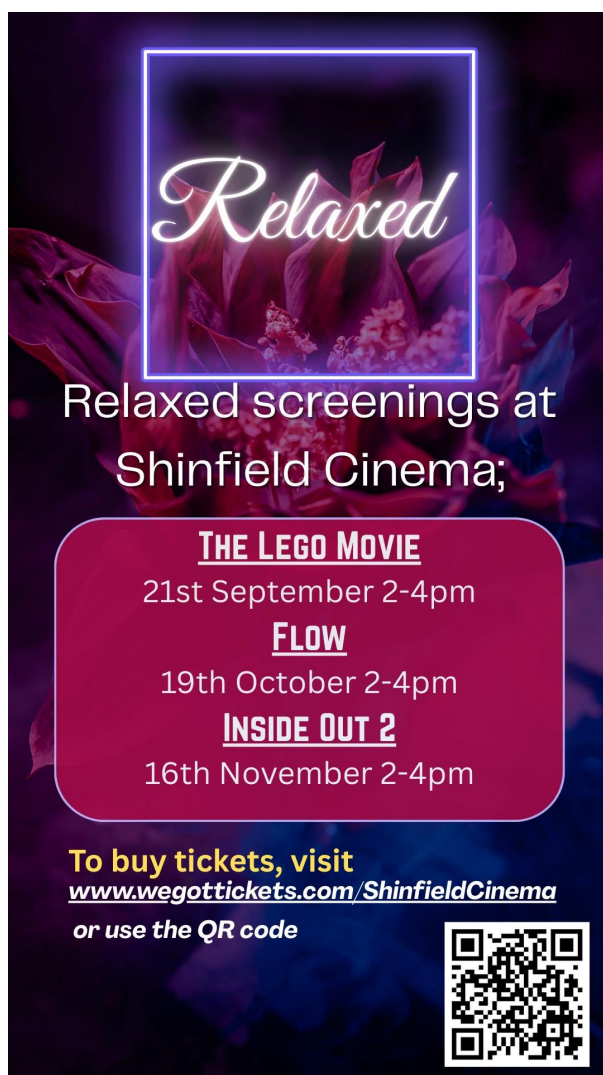


24th October **Mrs Warren's Profession** at 7.30pm

In addition, further monitoring will be carried out to ensure the pond remains healthy and suitable for local wildlife. We appreciate the community's ongoing support and will keep everyone informed of any further developments.

News from the Parish & Borough

From our Parish:

- **Macmillan Coffee Morning** at Spencers Wood Pavilion 25 September 2025.
Congratulations to the Social Seniors Coffee Morning organisers and attendees for raising an amazing £570! Ian Young said '*We had people arriving from all over - Shinfield, Grazeley, Ryeish Green and Three Mile Cross. Grand total raised was £570.00 - highest ever 😊*'. The popular Social Seniors Coffee Morning runs every Thursday 10-12pm and everyone is welcome - flyer in what's on section below.
- **SHARE Shinfield**, part of the wider SHARE Wokingham a local food sharing charity, continues to be a vital service for our community. Run by a dedicated team from Share Community Church, the SHARE exists to support people with food while also helping to reduce food waste. Importantly, it is open to everyone in the community, with a warm welcome for all. Alongside the food available to take home, visitors can also enjoy a free café, which provides a space for people to meet, chat, and feel connected. For many years, SHARE Shinfield was based at Shinfield Community Church. However, due to essential renovations, Shinfield Parish Council is pleased to have welcomed the Food Share to the **School Green Centre**, where it now takes place **every Monday (except bank holidays) from 11.45am to 1.00pm**. SHARE is made possible thanks to the hard work of more than 40 volunteers, who collect surplus food from local retailers, serve guests each week, and offer a much-valued befriending service. On average, 50–70 guests attend every Monday, benefiting from the food provided and the sense of community it creates. Share Shinfield is a wonderful example of how people can come together to support one another and ensure that good food does not go to waste.
- **Update on demolition of old Shire Hall Building:** The demolition of the huge office complex that used to be the offices of Berkshire County Council is progressing. The Shire Hall office complex at Shinfield Park was built in the Brutalist style in the 1970s to serve as the offices of the county council. [Read more here from Wokingham Today](#)

- **The Natural History Museum** has celebrated the start of construction at its new state-of-the-art collections, research and digitisation centre in Shinfield. - **Rainbow Tots Baby and Toddler Group at School Green Centre.** We are delighted to share that Rainbow Tots Baby and Toddler Group has found a new home at the

School Green Centre. Previously run brilliantly by Shinfield Community Church, the group needed to relocate while essential building renovations take place. Shinfield Parish Council was approached to help, and we were pleased to offer space at the School Green Centre. The group is now run by a wonderful team of volunteers, led by local resident Megan Jenkins, who has done an excellent job re-establishing Rainbow Tots after the summer holidays. The group is already thriving, with lots of parents, carers, and children attending each week. Rainbow Tots is open to everyone from birth to five years old. Sessions are designed to give parents and children the opportunity to play, learn, and build friendships in a welcoming environment. **Tuesdays, 9.15am – 11.30am** School Green Centre - suggested donation of £2 per family (if possible). A healthy fruit snack is provided for the little ones to enjoy. Looking ahead, Rainbow Tots will be holding a **Fancy Dress Party on Tuesday 21st October**, with special treats, party games, and prizes! Starting at uni or college means a lot more happens online — from managing your courses to sorting out your money and social life. With so much going digital, it's super important to know how to stay safe and avoid the common online risks.

Oh, we get it, your schedule is going to be packed. So our experts have put together some super easy tips to help you stay protected without getting in the way of your busy student life.



Keep your online student life trouble-free

Scams

Text, email, DMs, or calls pretending to be from banks, student loans — and even immigration authorities if you're an international student — are an everyday occurrence. Can you tell them from the real thing, especially in their days of AI? Always pause before clicking links, opening attachments or giving anyone access to your accounts or devices. If you suspect a message or website is a scam, run it past the AI-powered fraud detection tool Ask Silver at www.getsafeonline.org/asksilver

Banking & finance

Keep your financial details private. Use trusted apps or mobile wallets for payments. And if you're unsure about money matters, your Student Money Adviser is a great go-to.

Shopping

Trying a new website? Check if it's legit before buying or signing up — the Check a Website tool on Get Safe Online can help with that.

Payments

Avoid bank transfers to pay people or businesses you don't know, either for things like rent or deposits or buying trainers or tech. Paying by card usually offers better protection.

Accommodation

Always check new student digs in person before paying anything. Make sure the landlord or agent is for real, and use a credit card for deposits where you can — it's safer that way.

Sharing

Keep passwords, financial info and personal details to yourself. Double-check all location settings to protect your privacy. And be cautious with sharing photos — even innocent ones can be misused.

Respect & responsibility

There's no place online for bullying, hate speech, cyber abuse or radicalisation. And remember that uni and future employers usually check social media accounts, so keep it clean, legal and respectful.

Devices & Wi-Fi

Don't leave your devices lying around in the bar, on the bus or anywhere.



Avoid Wi-Fi hotspots for anything private or financial as they might be secure. Check your location and privacy settings regularly.

Gambling and gaming

Betting and gaming can both get addictive. If you think you're overdoing it, think about better ways to spend your time and money.

Dating

Choose and keep to reputable apps and keep chats inside the platform. Not everyone online is who they say they are, so if something seems off or just plain weird, don't hesitate to block or say no.

Get involved

Don't do anything that makes you uncomfortable — whether it's sharing photos, getting challenged to pranks or engaging in risky online behaviour. Don't pressure others either.

Too good to be true jobs

Be wary of work offers promising easy cash or using your bank account for payments. These can get you into serious trouble and even result in a criminal record.

Tech skills and the law

If you're big into coding or gaming, cybercriminals might try to lure you into illegal activity. Why not consider a career in cybersecurity instead?

Shinfield Volunteer Group Footpath Report Sept 2025



Shinfield Volunteer Group Footpath Report - September 2025

Welcome to our September report. I have not given the parish much time during September because I have been leading Loddon Valley Ramblers volunteer teams to lay 60 tons of material to uplift Sonning number one footpath along the river Thames. Following on from that was cutting back overhanging Willow trees and strimming long grass.

I did however receive some notifications regarding Shinfield footpaths so here is an update on those.

Residents in **Grazeley** complained that the landowner had ploughed out some of the crossfield footpaths and not reinstated the definitive line. This concerns Shinfield 30 and 32A. A more serious issue is that footpath 31A which is a headland path was completely ploughed out. This should be 1.5 metres of undisturbed surface but the attached photos show you would be walking on soft soil or mud after rain or chancing the ditch. You can bet your life that a crop will be obstructing this path in due course. Another issue which I have flagged up before is there is no side gate or gap for walkers to go around the horse gate on Bridleway 31B where it passes Grazeley school. I regard this as an obstruction for walkers. I passed on these concerns to our footpath officer and he in turn has taken the issues up with WBC.

Shinfield footpath 12.

The SVG and Parish Council are consulting with WBC about getting the Oak trees along this footpath between Hollow Lane and the Lidl store protected. Also, under discussion are improving the sight lines and introducing some solar lighting.

Shinfield footpath 28.

I became aware that this footpath between Leyland Gardens and Hollow Lane had some stinging nettles and draping bramble leaders. We removed them. It is with some disappointment that I have to report that some residents are throwing their bush cuttings over the fences onto the footpath surface. This amounts to fly tipping and is illegal as we all know and could amount to trip hazards. We sincerely hope this stops as quickly as it appears to have started.

If you like gardening and feel you could help as a SVG volunteer, maybe cutting a few brambles back we would like to hear from you. Our contact details are below.
