



Crochet Poppy with Four Petals

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This pattern has been written without abbreviations

MATERIALS

DK version (pictured).
Oddments of red and black (UK weight) double knitting yarn and a 4mm hook.

(This can be replaced with a 3.5mm or a 3mm hook for a smaller, firmer flower).

Alternatively, you can use oddments of red and black 4 ply yarn, using either a 2.75mm or a 2.5mm crochet hook.



INSTRUCTIONS

Using red yarn make 4 chain and join in a ring with a slip stitch.

Round 1 – Make 3 chain, then make 15 trebles into the ring. This gives you 16 stitches in total.

Join with a slip stitch to the top of the 3 chain at the beginning of the round to form a ring. (16 stitches).

This allows you four stitches around the edge, for each of the four petals.

PETALS

Row 1 – Make 3 chain (this counts as the 1st treble), miss the 3 chain you just made and make 1 treble, in the same place where you just made the slip stitch, (this represents 2 trebles now made), then make 2 trebles into each of the next 3 stitches. (8 stitches in total), turn.

Row 2 – Make 3 chain (this represents 1 treble).

Miss the 3 chain you just made and make 1 treble, in each of the next 2 stitches, (this represents 3 trebles now made).

Now make 2 trebles into each of the next 4 stitches, then 1 treble into the next stitch, followed by 1 treble into the top of the three chain at the end of the row, turn.

Row 3 – Make 1 chain and 1 double crochet into the 1st stitch. *Now make 2 chain, 1 double crochet into the next stitch*. Repeat from * to * until end of petal. Fasten off.

Re-join yarn to next stitch of round 1 and repeat Rows 1 -3 to make the next petal.

Continue in this manner until 4 petals are made.



FLOWER CENTRE

Using black yarn and make 4 chain. Leaving a long enough tail end to sew this section to the red poppy afterwards. Join in a ring with a slip stitch.

Make 3 chain, then make 10 trebles into the ring.

Join with a slip stitch to the top of the 3 chain at the beginning of the round to form a ring.

MAKING UP

Darn in all ends and stitch the black centre section to the to the front of the flower.



POPPY

1st round: Ch2, In second chain from hook, dc 11, join last dc to first with a slip stitch (10 sts)

2nd round: Ch1, *in 1st dc (dc, htr, tr), in 2nd dc 2 tr, in 3rd dc 3tr, in 4th dc (tr, htr, dc), ss into next dc* repeat from *to* (24 st)

3rd round: Ch1, in 1st st of previous round (dc, htr, tr), in next 10 stitches tr, 2tr, tr, 2tr, tr, 2tr, tr, 2tr, in 12th stitch of previous round (tr, htr, dc) ss into next dc.

In 14th st of previous round (dc, htr, tr) tr into next 9 st, into 23rd st of previous round (tr, htr, dc) ss into last st of previous round.

LEAF



1st row: Ch 6, In 2nd chain from hook, work 1dc, 1htr, 2tr, 1ht, 1dc, ch1 at end of row ss into back of second chain from hook to form picot, turn, 2nd row:, working along the other side of the chain, work 1dc, 1htr, 1tr, 1htr, 1dc.

Bind off and sew in ends, leaving a tail to attach leaf to flower.

Crochet Remembrance Poppies Pattern by Rebeckah's Treasures



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Crochet these fun, quick and easy poppies for Remembrance Day! Use a different hook size a yarn weight to change the size of your poppies.

You will need:

- crochet cotton thread size **10+/-** (I used *Ciruculo Clea but you can use any brand you prefer) - about **25-50m** (less than an oz) **in black, and red**
- 1.5mm hook
- tapestry needle

Abbreviations:

ch chain	sl st slip stitch
sc single crochet	scinc single crochet increase
dc double crochet	dcinc double crochet increase
rnd round	f/o fasten off

Outer Poppy Instructions: Make 1

with black...

rnd 1: magic circle 6 (6 st)

rnd 2: scinc, sl st, f/o (12 st)

with red...

rnd 3: scinc (24 st)

rnd 4: (sc, dcinc x 4, sc) x 4 (40 st)

rnd 5: (sc, dcinc x 8, sc) x 4, sl st join, f/o (72 st)

Inner Poppy Instructions: Make 1

with black...

rnd 1: magic circle 6, sl st, f/o (6 st)

with red...

rnd 2: scinc (12 st)

rnd 3: (sl st, ch 3, dc in same st, dc 2, ch 3, sl st into same st as last dc) x 4, sl st join, f/o (28 st)

Sew inner poppy to outer poppy. Weave in all ends. *Repeat rnds 1-4 of Outer Poppy for alternative inner poppy.

KNIT A POPPY

Make a poppy for Remembrance Day with this pattern from Cirencester Parish Church.

This free poppy knitting pattern was provided by Cirencester Parish Church, which in 2017 teamed up with the Cirencester branch of the Royal British Legion and crafters from all over the country to decorate the church with 17,000 knitted poppies. The Royal British Legion provides support to the Armed Forces community, including serving and ex-serving personnel and their families. www.britishlegion.org.uk has more details about the charity and Remembrance Day events near you. If you've got a spare few minutes and some scrap red yarn from your stash, why not use this knitting pattern to make your own bunch of poppies?

POPPY

Cast on 60 sts using 4mm needles and red DK yarn.

Rows 1-8 (K2, P2) to end.

Row 9 (K2tog) to end. [30 sts]

Row 10 (S2kpo) to end. [10 sts]

Break off yarn, leaving a long tail. Thread tail through remaining 10 sts and pull tight, then fasten off yarn.

Join the edges of the poppy together and sew the black button in the centre of the poppy.

'Valleys and Hills Poppy'

(Remembrance Crochet Poppy)

Lest We Forget



These crochet Poppies are worked flat in a crochet rib stitch that becomes a curved piece before joining into a 'cupped' circle. Crocheted using a few basic crochet stitches but the Poppies look like they have been knitted! Instructions include ideas for 3 different centres. Although you can get creative to your heart's desire. Gather up those old buttons and beads and make your Poppies truly special! These Poppies are ideal for attaching to a stem and arranging in a bouquet OR for use in Memorial Installations.

Materials: 8ply Red yarn – or preferred colour.

3.00mm crochet hook

Yarn needle

Optional: 23mm Button (for button centre) – or preferred size (I like using flat buttons)

Black 8ply yarn (for crochet centre)

Faux Fur Yarn in Black – or preferred colour

Small beads or pearls

Abbreviations:

ch = chain

dc = double crochet

htr = half treble

sl st = slip stitch

SURFACE SLIP STITCH –

This method will be used to embellish around the centre of the Poppy with Faux Fur.

- 1) Insert hook where you want to begin your surface slip stitches.
- 2) Holding the yarn behind your work, pull up a loop.
- 3) Insert your hook into the next space between stitches.
- 4) Yarn over hook and pull through your work
- 5) then pull through the loop on your hook, completing your slip stitch.

Directions are written for the Poppy Flower base with the centre options following thereafter. The entire piece is worked into the back loops of every stitch ONLY to form a 'rib stitch' I refer to as 'Valleys and Hills' hence the name of the pattern. This stitch creates a firm fabric. Thus being ideal for these Poppies to hold their 'cupped' shape.

Begin:

Using Red 8ply yarn and 3.00mm hook.

Row 1: (wrong side) Leaving a 6-8 inch tail for later use, ch12, work 1htr into the 5th ch from hook and in each of the next 5 chs, work 1dc into each of the last 2 chs.

Row 2: (right side) Working into the back loop only of each stitch for remainder of piece, ch1, work 1dc into back loop of each of the next 2dc, work 1htr into the back loop of each of the next 6htr.

Row 3: Ch5, (these ch stitches give a lovely edge around the outside of the Poppy), work 1htr into the back loop of each of the next 6htr, work 1dc into the back loop of each of the last 2dc.

Rows 4 – 24: Repeat rows 2 & 3 until you have a total 24 rows (12 ridges) ending with a right side row, **DO NOT FASTEN OFF**. You should have a curved piece of work at this stage – not quite a semi-circle.

With right sides together (working through both thicknesses) sl st the back loop of working end and the foundation ch stitches together for 8sts. Fasten Off and sew the end in.

To Make Up: Using the yarn needle and the 6-8 inch beginning tail gather up the inside (shortest curved edge) and fasten off firmly. You can use this yarn tail to attach a button. Otherwise sew the end in neatly.

Centre Options:

If you are choosing to add Faux Fur around the centre of your Poppy – follow the method for Surface Slip Stitch in the 'special abbreviation' section. Work around the inside edge of the dc section near the centre of the Poppy. Sew in the ends neatly. Using the end of your yarn needle 'fluff/tease' out the Faux Fur ends to make more visible.

Button: Simply attach a special button to the centre of your Poppy.

Crochet Centre: Using Black 8ply and 3.00mm crochet hook. Magic Ring, ch2, (counts as 1st htr) work 11 more htr into the ring, pull closed firmly, sl st to the top of the beginning ch2. Fasten off leaving a 6-8 inch tail for attaching to the centre of the Poppy. Sew the piece neatly to the centre of the Poppy using small even stitches. Sew in ends neatly.

Embellish: Use those special beads or pearls attach them to the centre of your Poppy. Be creative – make it unique. You may have some old military buttons or even themed buttons that hold precious memories.
